- Historic definition ... "including all countries of orthodox influence"
- Political definition ... "formerly under communist influence"



Countries of Eastern Europe - political



History: Flying in the GDR (1990)

- Flight into a Non-ICAO country => Permission by the German Federal Ministry of Transportation 5 days in advance
- Flight into Russian military controlled airspace => Permission 2 days in advance
- Flight Plan with entry point "SEAGUL" (south of Sweden) in the middle of the Baltic Sea
- Custom clearance in Barth
- Further flights permitted in control zone Barth:
 - ▶ Minimum altitude only 50 m
 - ▶ Service by Interflug personnel for Scenic Flights with local population
 - ▶ Advertising by flying over the villages
 - ▶ Compensation in "Ostmark"
 - ▶ No landing fees, but pilot (crop duster) instruction: VOR, NDB usage



4. Private flights

4.1 General

4.1.1 If an operator intends to perform private flights in transit across or making non-traffic stops in the territory of Romania, the applications must be transmitted so that they will be received by the public authorities concerned at least twenty four (24) hours before the departure time.

4.1.2 If an operator intends to perform private flights into Romania for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers and/or cargo, the applications must be submitted at least three (3) days in advance before the date of flight.

4.1.3 The first landing and the last take-off must be carried out at a previously designated international aerodrome.

4.1.4 The applications for private flights into Romania shall contain the following information:

- a) applicant name, nationality and address;
- b) aircraft type, registration marks and maximum take-off weight;
- c) flight general itinerary, route to be followed over the territory of Romania, landing/ take-off points and estimated times;
- d) purpose of flight, number of passengers and/or cargo nature and amount, if applicable;
- e) receiving party in Romania;
- f) FL and if IFR or VFR

4.2 Documentary requirements for clearance of aircraft

4.2.1 Same requirements as for SCHEDULED FLIGHTS.

6. Flights of civil aircraft registered in another state performed entirely or partially outside the published ATS routes

6.4 The above-mentioned application shall contain the following:

- e) copy of the document with the advice of the local public administration authority, in case the flight activity is performed on other fields than the authorized aerodromes;
This does not work in practice!!!
- f) copy of the insurance certificate for passengers and third parties liabilities, concluded in compliance with the legal provisions in force.
- 6.5 RCAA reserves itself the right to request any other documents, which are deemed relevant in granting the approval.
- 6.7 The operator of the aircraft is compelled to provide a copy of the flight approval to the aerodromes of origin and/or destination as the case may be.
This does not work in practice!!!

Application for Flights in Romania



In addition I have to mention that the Romanian Aeronautical Authority is not entitled to give the flight approval, unless it is for landings/take-offs on/from the airfields authorised by the authority. Their list is published in the AIP.

- In the application, specify your flight through Romania as if you do not plan to go to local airfields and receive your permit number.
- Once in Romania call the Romanian Aero Club to take responsibility for you and clear you to an airfield not under the control of the RCAA.








